ORDER

Now on the 6th day of September 2023, this matter came on for consideration before the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission, the licensee having executed a voluntary appearance, waiver of public hearing, plea of guilty, and consent to judgment, in regard to the charge filed on the 20th day of July 2023.

Upon consideration of all the evidence in this case, the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission finds:

1. That the licensee did, on or about July 3, 2023, fail to have their license framed and hung in plain view, in violation of Neb. Rev. Stat. Sec. 53-148 and/or 237-LCC6-019.01O of the Rules and Regulations of the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission.
2. That the licensee did, on or about May 23, 2023, and July 2, 2023, allow or permit a disturbance in or about the licensed premises, in violation of 237-LCC6-019.01F of the Rules and Regulations of the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission
3. That the licensee did purchase, receive, acquire, accept or possess alcoholic liquors from persons not authorized to sell to the licensee, in violation of Neb. Rev. Stat. Sec. 53-175.
4. That the licensee did, on or about June 4, 2023, sell, dispense, furnish or allow possession of alcoholic liquor to an individual who had become intoxicated by the previous consumption of alcoholic liquor, in violation of 237-LCC6-019.01N of the Rules and Regulations of the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission.
5. That the licensee did, on or about May 28, 2023, and June 4, 2023, permit the carrying out from its licensed premise, alcoholic liquor in open containers, in violation Neb. Rev. Stat. Sec. 53-123.04 and/or 237-LCC6-019.01H of the Rules and Regulations of the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission.
6. That the licensee did, on or about July 3, 2023, leave alcoholic liquors in an unsecure, unattended location, in violation of 53-1,100 of the Nebraska Liquor Control Act.
7. That the license should be suspended for a period of sixty (60) days, with the option to pay a penalty in lieu thereof.


IT IS THEREFORE CONSIDERED, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the Retail Class I Liquor License of Engine House Café on the Lake, DBA – “Boat House Bar & Grill”, 10005 W Davey Rd, Raymond, Nebraska, should be, and the same hereby is, suspended for a period of sixty (60) days, such suspension to commence at the closing hour of business on the 28th day of April 2024, and to continue until the opening hour of business on the 28th day of June 2024, with the option to pay a penalty in lieu thereof.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the notice of suspension shall be posted upon the premises, said notice to remain posted throughout the term of said suspension.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Licensee shall pay costs of this action, assessed in the amount of \$0.00.
