**ORDER**

Now on the 9th day of August 2016, this matter came on for consideration before the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission, notice having been served upon the licensee to appear and respond to an administrative citation alleging that the license should not be suspended, cancelled or revoked as more fully set out herein, in regards to the charge filed on the 13th day of June 2016.

In accordance with Commission's policies, a proper notice was sent by U.S. regular mail.

The licensee was not present nor represented. The Commission was represented by Millissa Johnson-Wiles, Assistant Attorney General.

Upon consideration of all the evidence in this case, the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission finds:

**FINDINGS OF FACT:**

1. That the licensee did, on or about January 30, 2016 permit the selling, dispensing, or giving away of alcoholic liquor, to or for an individual being less than 21 years of age.

**CONCLUSION OF LAW:**

1. That permitting the selling, dispensing, or giving away of alcoholic liquor, to or for an individual being less than 21 years of age is in violation of Neb. Rev. Stat. Sec. 53-180 and/or 237-LCC6-019.01A of the Rules and Regulations of the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission.

2. That the license should be suspended for two (2) days mandatory closure, and suspended for an additional fifty-two (52) days, with the option to pay a fine in lieu thereof.

3. That the licensee and all staff shall complete an approved alcohol server training program within sixty (60) days from the date of this Order and shall show certification with complying with the provision of 237-LCC14-004 of the Rules and Regulations of the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission.

4. That an Order to Show Cause hearing should be set before the Commission to determine who is in charge of the licensed premise.


IT IS THEREFORE CONSIDERED, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the Retail Class I Liquor License of Rodriguez Restaurante Inc, dba Premier Night Club, 111 E 6th Street, Lexington, NE, should be, and the same hereby is, suspended for two (2) days mandatory closure, and suspended for an additional fifty-two(52) days, with the option to pay a fine in lieu thereof, such mandatory closure to be September 26, 2016 & September 27, 2016; and the additional fifty-two (52) days suspension to commence on September 28, 2016, and to continue until the opening hour of business on the 19th day of November 2016. Additionally, that the licensee and all staff shall complete an approved alcohol server training program within sixty (60) days from the date of this Order and shall show certification with complying with the provision of 237-LCC14-004 of the Rules and Regulations of the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission. Furthermore, that an Order to Show Cause hearing shall be held at its offices on the 5<sup>th</sup> floor of the State Office Building, located at 301 Centennial Mall South, Lincoln, Nebraska on Wednesday, September 7<sup>th</sup>, 2016 at 1:15 P.M. or as soon thereafter as it may to heard to determine who is in charge of the licensed premise.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the notice of suspension shall be posted upon the premises, said notice to remain posted throughout the term of said suspension.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Licensee shall pay costs of this action, assessed in the amount of \$25.00.


